**PRESENTATION**

*The candidate for baptism, parents, sponsors and the whole assembly gathers around the font in the narthex. The presiding minister addresses the assembly*

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism.

By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ.

We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

*First Lutheran is a community, a gathering of people of diverse ages, cultures and traditions.*

*Just as Jesus opened himself to all and, by implication, opened the reign of God to all, so we, the members of First Lutheran seek to do the same.*

*Therefore, all are welcome here regardless of their race, gender or sexual orientation; regardless of their social, economic, educational, linguistic or relationship status; regardless of their citizenship, religious or cultural background or makeup of their family; and regardless of their physical, mental, emotional or spiritual condition. *The minister addresses the parents*

Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God,  
do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ? **We do.**

As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism,  
you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with her among God's faithful people,  
bring her to the word of God and the holy supper,  
teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,  
place in her hands the holy scriptures,  
and nurture her in faith and prayer,  
so that your child may learn to trust God,  
proclaim Christ through word and deed,  
care for others and the world God made,  
and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life? **We do.**

*The minister addresses the sponsors*

Do you promise to nurture *Harper Adelyn* in the Christian faith  
as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help her live in the covenant of baptism  
and in communion with the church? **We do.**

*The minister addresses the assembly*

People of God, do you promise to support *Harper Adelyn*  
and pray for her in her new life in Christ? **We do.**

#### PROFESSION OF FAITH

*The minister addresses the gathered community*

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? **I renounce them.**

*The minister addresses the assembly*

Do you believe in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

*The presiding minister addresses the parents only*

Do you promise to be loving parents to your child and bring her up  
in the spirit of the gospel—that is, the spirit of forgiveness and understanding? **We do.**

Do you promise to remain faithful to your child whatever the future may bring,  
to respect her wherever she may go, and to remember always that your child  
is born of God? **We do.**

#### THE GIVING OF THE NAME

By what name do you wish your child to be called now and in eternal life?

*The Christian name of the candidate is spoken aloud*

*Harper Adelyn*

May this name be written forever in the Book of Life, in the palm of God's hand.

#### THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

*Water is poured into the font during the words of the prayer over the water*

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Blessed are you, holy God. You are the creator of the waters of the earth.  
You are the fire of rebirth. You poured out your Spirit on your people Israel.  
You breathe life into our dry bones. Your Son Jesus promised to send the Spirit to us  
that the world may know your peace and truth.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, and breathe new life into the one who is here baptized.  
By your Spirit adopt us all as your children, through our Saviour Jesus Christ,  
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

#### THE HOLY WASHING

*The presider baptizes by pouring water over the candidate three times while saying*

*Harper Adelyn*, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

*The newly-baptized is welcomed by the gathered community. During this time, the assembly may be  
“aspurged” or sprinkled with water as a reminder of our baptism.*

*The liturgy continues with the “Epiklesis” - the “calling down and coming of the Holy Spirit”*

#### PRAYER FOR THE HOLY SPIRIT

Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give  
your daughter new birth, cleanse her from sin, and raise her to eternal life.

*Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays*

Sustain *Harper Adelyn* with the gift of your Holy Spirit:  
the spirit of wisdom and understanding,  
the spirit of counsel and might,  
the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord,  
the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen.**

#### CHRISMATION

*Using oil prepared for this purpose, the presiding minister anoints the newly-baptized  
and marks the forehead with the sign of the cross.*

*Harper Adelyn*, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit  
and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.**

#### WELCOME

*A lighted candle is given to the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says*

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works  
and glorify your Father in heaven.

*The gathered community speaks its welcome led by a representative of the congregation*

Let us welcome the newly baptized today.

**We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share:  
join us in giving thanks and praise to God  
and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.**

*The minister gives the following blessing to all*

Beloved ones, we entrust you all to the mercy and help of God.  
May the Holy One watch over your life; may we all walk by the light of faith;  
and may we finally receive all the good things God has promised us. **Amen.**

*The baptismal party and assembly enters the sanctuary for the hymn. All remain standing for the hymn*

**SECOND READING: Revelation 12:7–12**

*Armed with the power of God, Michael and the angels of God fight those armed with the power of evil, the devil and the devil's angels. The "blood of the Lamb," our crucified Lord Jesus, gives Michael the power to force the devil from a place in heaven.*

<sup>7</sup>And war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon. The dragon and his angels fought back, <sup>8</sup>but they were defeated, and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. <sup>9</sup>The great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him. <sup>10</sup>Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, proclaiming,  
 "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God  
 and the authority of his Messiah, for the accuser of our comrades  
 has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God.

<sup>11</sup>But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they did not cling to life even in the face of death.

**GOSPEL ACCLAMATION** (*all sing alleluia verse before and after the reading*)       p. 188

**GOSPEL: Luke 10:1-11, 16–20**

*The missionary church ("the seventy-two") is given magnificent power. Greater than this gift of power over the enemy, however, is the gift of salvation: their names are written in heaven.*

*Response after announcement:*   **Glory to you, O God.**

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. <sup>2</sup>He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. <sup>3</sup>Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. <sup>4</sup>Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. <sup>5</sup>Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' <sup>6</sup>And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. <sup>7</sup>Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the laborer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. <sup>8</sup>Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; <sup>9</sup>cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' <sup>10</sup>But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, <sup>11</sup>'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.' <sup>16</sup>Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me. <sup>17</sup>The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" <sup>18</sup>He said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. <sup>19</sup>See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. <sup>20</sup>Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

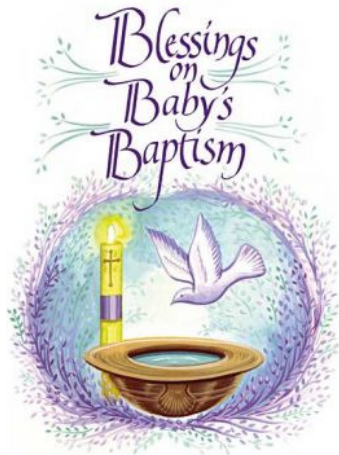

# Psalms Bible Study, First Lutheran Church

## Saturdays, 11am-12:30pm

Looking for a chance to learn more about God and the Bible?

Looking for a Bible Study that you can join whenever you have the time?

Looking for a chance to connect with others in a community of faith?

Join us for our year of Bible Study on the Psalms!

“Life is always a kaleidoscope of conflicting experiences and emotions—and we find this variety reflected in the contents of the Old Testament psalms.”

J. W. Drane, *Introducing the Old Testament*.

Within our scriptures is ancient yet relevant poetry that describes the complexity of human life, and the rich relationship that humans have with God. Martin Luther described the Psalms as the ‘little Bible’ or ‘the Bible within the Bible,’ and believed that the Psalms articulate the whole gospel of God’s grace and steadfast love.

The purpose of this course is to provide a safe space to explore the full gamut of human emotion and experience with God not only in the Psalms, but also in our lives.

After a brief class introducing the Psalms, five different psalms will be studied and discussed each class. All members of this study will be given the opportunity to bring in personal insights and share unique perspectives and experiences.

You do not have to be a biblical expert to join this study! All that is required is that we all come just as we are, and also with a Bible, writing pad and pencil in hand, to explore the riches that are before us in our faith tradition. No previous knowledge necessary!

Do not worry if you are too busy to commit to the entire year-long course! You do not need to come to consecutive classes in order to join in the study—come whenever you can! All of the psalms will be posted for each specific class so you have the opportunity to read and pray through the poems if you have a chance prior to the study.
